**The National Honor Society (NHS)** is the nation's premier organization established to recognize outstanding high school students. More than just an honor roll, NHS serves to honor those students who demonstrate excellence in the areas of scholarship, leadership, service, and character.

**The AP Program** offers several AP Scholar Awards to recognize high school students who have demonstrated college-level achievement through AP courses and exams.

### AWARD LEVELS

**AP Scholar:** Granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams.

**AP Scholar with Honor:** Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

**AP Scholar with Distinction:** Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

**State AP Scholar:** Granted to the one male and one female student in each U.S. state and the District of Columbia with scores of 3 or higher on the greatest number of AP Exams, and then the highest average score (at least 3.5) on all AP Exams taken.

**National AP Scholar:** Granted to students in the United States who receive an average score of at least 4 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams.



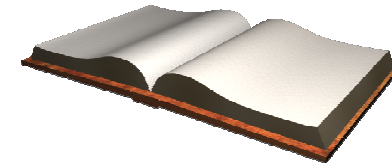
